How are YOU treating Jesus?

Our Church is really great at a lot of things. No one feeds more of the worlds' hungry and clothes more of the worlds' naked than the Catholic Church. This is as it should be, because as our Lord Himself declared, 'how we treat people who need us, is how we treat HIM. A sobering thought if perhaps we're not doing all we could. According to Jesus, our very salvation can depend on it! One of the areas in which our Church could really improve, however, is how she visits those in prison. True enough, there are a number of dedicated ministries that seek to meet the spiritual needs of those in prison, but we live in a culture that largely demonizes the imprisoned, and that attitude tends to affect us without our even realizing it. I know this was true in my case...Until I became an inmate, myself! The truth is, I have been blessed far beyond anything I could ever deserve. It was in prison that God brought me out of darkness into His Church. He's shown me that I have gifts to offer to my brothers and sisters that Id' never known I had. But as Blessed Teresa of Calcutta said, "The greatest threat to many is a kind of poverty of affection, of love." In other words, we're lonely. This is especially true for those of us in prison. We are largely cut off from family, many of us completely abandoned by those we held dear. I don't really know how to describe the sense of utter solitude and desolation of heart that one can experience in prison. I am not saying that we shouldn't be punished for our crimes, but can there not also be compassion? It is not practical for most people to physically visit those in prison, but nearly everyone can write to those in prison. This kind of 'visit' takes only a little time and a stamp. You don't have to send money ---ever. You don't have to be a theologian or a saint. Just be a friend. And please, prayerfully considering 'visiting' Jesus in prison!

Don't Sweat the Small Stuff..... And it's all small stuff!

Acknowledge the Totality of Your Being

orba the Greek was said to have described himself as "the whole catastrophe." The truth is, we're all the whole catastrophe, only we wish that we weren't. We deny the parts of ourselves that we deem unacceptable rather than accepting the fact that we're all less than perfect. One of the reasons its' important to accept all aspects of yourself is that it allows you to be easier on yourself, more compassionate. When you act or feel insecure, rather than pretending to be 'together,' you can open to the truth and say to yourself, "I'm feeling frightened and that's okay." If you're feeling a little jealous, greedy, or angry, rather than deny or bury your feelings, you can open to them, which helps you move through them quickly and grow beyond them. When you no longer think of your negative feelings as a big deal, or as something to fear, you will no longer be as frightened by them. When you open to the totality of your being you no longer have to pretend that your life is perfect, or even hope that it will be. Instead you can accept

yourself as you are, right now. When you acknowledge the less than perfect parts of yourself, something magical begins to happen. Along with the negative, you'll also begin to notice the positive, the wonderful aspects of yourself that you may not have given yourself credit for, or perhaps even been aware of. You'll notice that while you may, at time, act with self-interest in mind, at other times you're incredibly selfless. Sometimes you may act insecure or frightened, but most often you are courageous. While you can certainly get uptight, you can also be quite relaxed. Opening to the totality of your being is like saying to yourself, "I may not be perfect, but I'm okay just the way I am." When negative characteristics arise you can begin to recognize them as part of a bigger picture. Rather than judging and evaluating yourself simply because you're human, see if you can treat yourself with loving-kindness and great acceptance. You may indeed be "the whole catastrophe," but you can relax about it. So are the rest of us.

o you receive in the mail various medals, crosses, holy cards, etc. from missionary groups and other religious organizations, and don't really know what to do with them? If so, consider becoming a parish representative to 'collect these items' from other parishioners and sending them occasionally to us for use in our street ministry. The youth are always grateful to have these small tokens of faith and hope. SPIRITUAL LIFE: Praying for them to know, love and worship God (John 17:3), to develop Christ like lifestyles (Eph 4:13), to grow in the Body of Christ (Acts 2:42) and to serve the Lord in their lives (Luke 24:45)

PERSONAL LIFE: Praying for them to have good health habits (Prov 4:20-23), to use talents and abilities well (Matt 25:14-21) to carefully manage their 'stuff' (Luke 16:10) and to wisely use their time, energy, money and life priorities (Eph 5:15-21)

FAMILY AND HOME LIFE: Praying for God to unite the family in His love (I John 4:9-11), for parents to nurture and train them (Deut. 6:6-7), for children to honor and obey parents (Eph. 6:1-3), and for children to do 'chores' willingly (Phil. 2:3-4)

SCHOOL AND WORK LIFE: Praying for them to love learning and knowledge (Prov. 2:6), to learn good work habits (Deut. 6:6-7), to work well under authority (Co. 3: 22-25), and to discover God's life calling (I Peter 4:10-11)
