What the ex-convict said

"Dad went to jail" was a common refrain in our house when I was growing up.

My dad wasn't an inmate, though. He was a Catholic deacon who ministered to prisoners for 15 years. When he died suddenly of a heart attack, letters from griefstricken inmates filled our mailbox. My dad lived the words of Jesus in Matthew 25:36: "I was in prison and you visited me."

As the years passed without him, I prayed that I could be more like my dad. But as a stay-at-home mom with four children, I didn't think I would be fulfilling Jesus' words in quite the way he did. No visits with prisoners were on my calendar-until the morning that God scheduled one for me.

It was a lovely Sunday on the first day of spring. After Mass, my husband, our young children, my cousin, and I went out to a local restaurant for brunch. We were sitting around the table, enjoying God's blessings, when a loud curse word flew through the air from a man seated in the chair directly behind me.

I didn't even look to see who'd said it. With my protective "mama bear" instincts bristling, I leaned back in my chair.

"Please watch your language," I said to the man. "We have children with us."

Then I looked at him. As I waited for his response, I saw his long, greasy hair, his huge frame, and the scar beside his eye. I have to admit, if I'd looked first, I might not have had the courage to speak.

"Oh, gee..." he began. I braced myself for his sarcastic response, but I also felt the Lord nudging me: Smile and look him in the eye. So I did.

At first the man could hardly look at me. He seemed self-conscious, and maybe a bit surprised that I was challenging him with respect instead of cringing in fear. When he finally met my gaze, his whole demeanor changed.

"I'm sorry," he said sincerely. "I just got out of prison, and I forget where I am and how to act sometimes."

The rest of the meal passed peacefully, and when the group behind us got up to leave, the man approached our table.

"Again, I'm really sorry," he said.

After he left, my husband and my cousin looked at me in disbelief.

"He was huge," they said, shaking their heads. I never felt fear. I didn't have time. He might have looked tough on the outside, but when I met that man's eyes. I understood that when we visit prisoners, we visit Jesus.

I'd like to think that when I looked into his eyes, I visited him in the loneliness of his prison cell. The cell that remained inside of him and isolated him-even after he left jail. The cell that stayed locked and trapped him in his past mistakes.

But maybe it was the other way around. Maybe I was the inmate, locked in a world that doesn't give a cursing ex-convict a second glance. Maybe he was the one who came to visit me in that prison and show me the way outthe way that begins with looking into a person's eyes and seeing God inside.

Although I've never been put in a physical jail, I've been imprisoned by enough sin in my life to know that, although I'm on the unlocked side of the bars, I'm not truly free except in Christ. I might not lob profanity through the air in a restaurant, but I'm just as guilty of other offenses. I can only pray that when I'm called to task, I'm as humble. and sincere in my repentance as that ex-convict was in his.

Since that morning, I have a new way of thinking about Jesus' words in Matthew 25:35-36. I still want to be like my dad, but I see now that I don't have to go to a physical jail like he did to visit a prisoner (although that's a wonderful thing to do).

Prisoners are all around me: people trapped in cells of sin, loneliness, self-loathing, discouragement, and despair. When I look them in the eyes with love and respect, I can visit them there. I can visit God there—the same God who shined in the eyes of an ex-convict and gave me a glimpse of his grace. The same God who hung on a cross, gazed into the eyes of a criminal, and said, "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise" (Luke 23:43).

CHRIST MIGHT SAY:

y Child, few men on earth have peace of soul because few care to let me manage their lives as I wish. Many put more faith in their own limited abilities then in My infinite wisdom and power. Some resign themselves to My Will, but they make a few exceptions; and in these exceptions they trust themselves more than Me. In these matters they are ready to sin rather than to have their plans changed. Others surrender themselves in all things, but after a while they begin to weaken in some particular matter. They are too impatient to wait for the perfect reward which I have prepared for those who love Me. None of these people will ever know Me intimately nor will they ever receive the peace of soul which I have promised to my loyal followers. Their loyalty is too imperfect

because of a false self-interest. Forget self and you will find someone far greater, ME! Let Me decide what your life shall be each day. No offering of yours can please Me completely until you have given Me the greatest gift of all, your will. Do this by preferring whatever I send you each day. Do your very best, and then accept the results as My Will. In everything that comes to you this day, see My Will. Use your intelligence and your will to live a useful and holy life.
